The workshop aims to raise awareness on the importance of waste management and the adoption of circular economy principles in the local community. It will also present how the project has been promoting these principles through collaborations with local authorities, stakeholder mapping, and the development of its ongoing trainers programme.

In conclusion, this gathering will strengthen collaboration between educational providers, local authorities, and key industry players to identify emerging market needs and successfully align educational training to the local context.
